Day 1

Wednesday 26 April 2017

10am-3pm Welcome to Country and walk 6km along the rocky streambed through Barfold Gorge exploring this geologically significant site.

3.30-5pm Afternoon tea at Redesdale Hall and public information session about cultural heritage and the local geology presented by Dr Julian Hollis.

Evening Dinner at The Redesdale Hotel for event participants and accommodation at Lake Eppalock Caravan Park.

Day 2

Thursday 27 April 2017

10am-1pm Welcome to Country and canoe 4km between Barnadown and English's bridges with a midway lunch stop at Rocky Crossing Reserve. Over lunch, Dja Dja Wurrung talk about local cultural heritage sites and Mike Gilby (Fisheries Victoria) to describe the current Indigenous fishing practices pilot project.

2-4pm See river restoration works completed through the North Central CMA's Caring for the Campaspe project and hear from Dja Dja Wurrung Enterprises about their work along the Elmore River Walk.

4.30-6pm Afternoon tea at the Rochester Recreation Reserve and public information session covering cultural heritage and environmental flows. Guest presentation by geomorphologist Dr lan Rutherfurd.

Evening Dinner at the Rochester Rec Reserve and accommodation in Echuca.

Day 3

Friday 28 April 2017

9am-12pm Welcome to Country and 4km canoe trip, finishing at Echuca's Rotary Park at the newly constructed fishway.
