



Environmental Watering of Gunbower Forest

From mid-June to early November, North Central Catchment Management Authority (CMA) will be delivering water for the environment to Gunbower Forest.

River regulation in the Murray-Darling Basin now means that floods which used to spill out of the river into Gunbower Forest are less frequent, and often do not last as long as they

once did.

Regular flooding is vital for the health of the forest's trees, wetlands and wildlife. Delivering water for the environment enables the forest to receive a drink when it needs it, instead of waiting for a large-scale natural flood.

The watering will allow native plants to flourish over spring and summer, attracting and supporting native animals and drawing visitors.



Water for the environment delivery

The delivery of up to 82 GL of water for the environment will begin in mid-June. At the peak of watering, up to approximately 3,000 ha of the middle and lower sections of Gunbower Forest will be inundated (see map overpage), or about 15 per cent of the forest

Watering is expected to finish in early November, before the Christmas holiday season, unless there is an important waterbird breeding event that requires small volumes to top-up wetlands.



Forest access during watering

Plans for watering Gunbower Forest means at times access to some parts of the forest may be restricted between June and November 2018, however most of the forest will be open for business

For safety, it is important visitors obey track access notices in the forest.


