

WORKSHOP FEES

HOW TO APPLY

The course is open to farmers in the North Central Catchment. People from outside the catchment are welcome to apply but priority will be given to those from within the catchment.

One Day Workshop for farmers keen to overcome barriers in adopting alternative grazing management techniques

Expressions of interest (EOI) are now open a one day workshop in advanced grazing for managers of livestock or mixed farming operations.

Grazing management can help farmers build confidence in regenerating their soil and pasture health which supports profit in times of increased climate variation.


They also benefit integrated pest management strategies by providing habitat for predatory insects and bees.

The course will cover a range of topics including:

- How to set up a grazing management demonstration site
- Perennial pasture species identification
- Measuring changes in nutrient cycling, water infiltration and stability of your soil
- Managing key soil health processes to improve soil condition and increase farm resilience
- Increasing profitability while lowering risk

What to expect once you have completed the workshop and set up your grazing management demonstration site

- Grazing impact on soil health and animal performance
- Timing knowing when to shift stock to greener pastures
- Knowing when your paddock is ready for grazing
- Making sure you do not run out of grass
