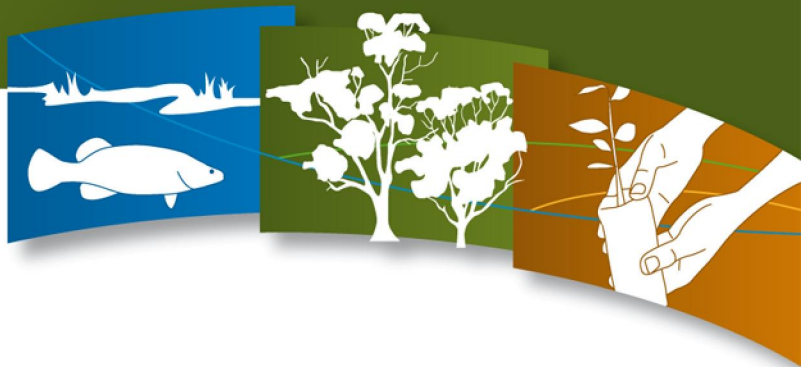


# WETLANDS... WONDERLANDS...
