## **EOI ANNOUNCED**

## Call for Expressions of Intent for the Farm Water Program (On-farm Irrigation Efficiency Program)

On behalf of the Farm Water Program Consortium, which includes the North Central Catchment Management Authority, the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority is calling for Expressions of Intent (EoI) from irrigators seeking financial assistance to modernise their farms. Across the Goulburn-Murray Irrigation District, \$25.8 million is available from the Australian Government's On-farm Irrigation Efficiency Program for farm infrastructure improvements such as:

- high flow surface irrigation
- laser grading
- irrigation tail-water re-use systems
- automatic irrigation
- irrigation scheduling.

Irrigators in the regulated parts of the Goulburn–Murray Water Service Area interested in improving their systems to current best practice standards can now submit an EoI to participate in the Farm Water Program through their local DPI Project Officer.

Farm Water will fund projects that will increase farm productivity and water savings. Eligible activities are limited to improved flood irrigation and irrigation scheduling equipment and software. Sprinkler and sub surface drip activities are **not** eligible for funding under the current program (2010–11).

Projects to improve on-farm water use and management must save at least 20 megalitres of water. It is important to note that a minimum of 50% of this water saving must be transferred to the Australian Government as an unencumbered water entitlement.





















To be eligible to submit an EoI for this project, the following must apply:

- 1. Irrigators hold a surface water share (high or low reliability) in the Goulburn–Murray Water region and have a Water Use Licence.
- 2. The land on which works are proposed is irrigated or has been irrigated in the past.
- 3. The works have not commenced.
- 4. Irrigators are willing to transfer at least half of the water savings (minimum 10 ML) to the Australian Government
- 5. Irrigators must reasonably expect to be able to obtain the relevant approvals to transfer this water to the Australian Government, e.g. mortgagees and/or other parties who have an interest in the water shares
- 6. Answer YES to at least one of these questions related to access to water:
  - Be connected to the Goulburn–Murray Water channel system backbone channel
  - · Have a connections agreement with NVIRP
  - Be in the Goulburn-Murray Water region on a regulated waterway.
- 7. Irrigators have a whole farm plan (WFP) showing the proposed works. (If irrigators do not have a WFP, they can commence the application process but will need to complete the WFP before the application can be approved). Assistance in preparing this WFP (and also financial assistance) is available from Department of Primary Industries.
- 8. Proposed works are able to be completed within 18 months from the signing of contracts.
- 9. Irrigators have public liability insurance cover of at least \$20 million.

Irrigators should note that the transfer of water shares to the Australian Government through this program is exempt from the 4% Limit on Trade. However, other water trading rules still apply.
