This Regional Forum will again bring together key landholders, local farmers, scientists, Natural Resource Management (NRM) policy makers and the broader public to discuss how we secure the productive and environmental values of our soils in North Central Victoria.

Keynote speakers include Julian Cribb - journalist and science communication specialist – and Declan McDonald - Statewide specialist, Productive Soils Victorian Department of Primary Industries – who will highlight the issues arising from a growing population and how our soils will support the pressure of these demands. *See prospective agenda overleaf*.

The forum will also consider climate change, contemporary farming systems, and economic circumstances that place pressure on the land.
