



PADDOCK POTENTIAL OF NATIVE GRASSES Information Day 22 March 2012 Survey Results

The Paddock Potential of Native Grasses Information Day aimed to inform participants about the opportunities and benefits of native pasture species to agricultural productivity and for conservation. Thirty four of the thirty five attendees completed the evaluation survey. A summary of the results is as follows.

Background

Questions 1-6

The majority of attendees were males (62%) with the over 60 age group (42%), and property owners/managers (87%) well represented. Lamb and wool producers comprised over half the participants followed by beef and grain.

Improvement

Question 7-8

Feedback from the presentations was very positive, with a significant number responding that they have improved knowledge as a result of the day, and that they had learned something that they would implement such as:

- "retain native grasses and support their growth and spread rather than consider them noxious weeds"
- "interested to try combining native pastures with Lucerne as a means of permanent sustainable pasture for sheep grazing"
- "inter row plant native grasses in tree plots for 'Green Haystacks"
